

Baptist Prep Cyber Days

Baptist Prep is pleased to announce that we will utilize our "Cyber Days" again this year. A Cyber Day is defined as a day which has been established as an alternative to a traditional school day. Cyber Days were created to be used as a replacement to make up days which have traditionally been added onto the end of the regular school year. The procedure for Cyber Days implemented by Baptist Prep has been approved by our accrediting agency. Any Cyber Day used will count as a regular school day.

The use of a Cyber Day is determined by school administration. Once the decision has been made to use a Cyber Day, you will be notified by text, email, and telephone through our RenWeb parent alert system. The message will say something similar to, "Baptist Prep will not meet today due to inclement weather. Cyber Day #1 is in effect." This will be the cue for parents of Lower School students to login to RenWeb to find the lessons for Cyber Day 1, Cyber Day 2, etc. Please Note: This year, Upper School students will use Google Classroom to access all Cyber Day Lessons.

PARENTS, PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR CONTACT INFORMATION IN RENWEB IS UP TO DATE.

The Cyber Day lessons are prepared by classroom teachers from grades K5-12th. There are no Cyber Day or make-up lessons for K3 or K4. Grade level teacher and content area teachers work together to plan and implement Cyber Day lessons both vertically and horizontally. Even though the content, time requirement, and level of rigor may vary depending upon grade level, expectations are similar.

Additional information on Cyber Days:

- Students will have seven (7) days including weekends to complete the assignment once school is back in session. Allowing seven (7) days after returning to school will also allow for power outages that could keep students from having access to the assignments. So, if you want them to play in the snow, have them play in the snow!
- Each assignment will be graded and recorded in grades K5-12th

- ESTIMATED completion times for all assignments:
 - \circ K5 1st grade 1 ½ hours
 - o 2nd 3rd grade 2 hours
 - o 4th 6th grade 3 hours
 - o 7th 12th grade 4 hours
- Cyber Days will have order and start with Cyber Day #1, CD #2, CD #3, CD #4, followed by Cyber Day #5. The maximum number of Cyber Days allowed is five (5). Any days missed beyond the 7 days (5 Cyber Days plus the 2 snow days already scheduled) will be added at the end of the school year.
- Upper School students will access assignments through the Google Classroom stream for each course.
- Lower School assignments are accessed on the RenWeb page of the student's home room teacher, unless the teacher has posted another method of assessment.
